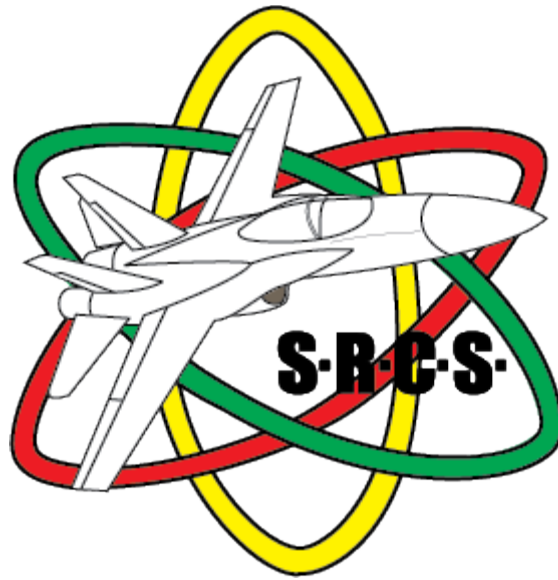

Purpose

Briefings are required before many events, usually at the start of every day of the event. This is often essential to ensure that the event is conducted in a safe manner particularly if non club members are taking part. They may be formally required by CASA or even just to ensure that all fliers know what is required to participate.

No two events are identical, so it is not possible to provide a standard script. This guide though provides a list of typical topics to help avoid anything major being overlooked.

Possible Topics

Welcome general and specific

Food and toilets information

CASA/SRCS require a briefing to all pilots (even if Intention is just to have fun)

Most of you may be familiar with the contents

What type of event; private event, public invited, public display

Do non SRCS Members have to be signed in

Any restrictions on who can fly, and how to solve any issues this generates

36 MHz Keyboard Pound only if more than one on same frequency

What is the maximum Height 400', 1000' or 2000'

Is there an observer to look out for full size flying near.

Advise pilots what to do if potential conflict with full size

Full size airfield so take off could happen, but we should have warning

If aircraft looks like joining circuit or maybe landing then all models must land as soon as practical.

What is the flying area

Contest Briefing if needed

No taxi in pits

Where is start up area

Pre-take off hold place

Is there a flight line controller

Space out the standing positions at barrier

Max Number of aircraft to be airborne

Is clear air possible if needed

Do pilots need a co-pilot and what is their role

If multiple aircraft, talk to each other landing take offs circuits low passes etc or via flight line controller

Circuit and aerobatic requirements/restriction

Are there going to be periods reserved for particular aircraft types

If Night Flying allowed how to be organised (MOP018)

Welcome and talk to non-flying visitors (if appropriate)

SRCS Information
